

Do you want an easier way to get Malaria medications for you and your family? Have you had problems finding a pharmacy willing or able to give you a full year's supply? Are you tired of filling out expense reports for the malaria pills you buy? Are you aware that you should not be using your ExxonMobil Employee Health Benefit Plan to purchase anti-malarials? If so, here's the solution. The Medicine and Occupational Health Department (MOH) recently contracted with Wal-Mart Mail Order Pharmacy Services to provide anti-malarial medications for U.S. based Rotators, EXPATS and their dependent family members.

To receive Malaria Medications by Mail:

- Complete the Patient Information section of the attached Malaria Chemoprophylaxis Prescription Fax Order Form in one of two ways:
 1. Open the word document, enter all of the necessary information, save the changes, send the document to your physician as an attachment to an e-mail, for him/her to complete the prescription information or print the document with your saved changes and bring it to the prescribing doctor.
 2. Or, print the pdf document, write in the necessary information and bring it to the physician prescribing the anti-malarial medications.

For Exxon Mobil employees this can be a company doctor and for eligible dependents your family doctor. If the individual is a dependent fill in his/her name as the patient and use the employee's personnel number.

- Ask the doctor to complete the Prescription Information Section of the form and FAX it to Wal-Mart Mail Order Pharmacy Services (the fax number is on the form).

That's it. Once your doctor sends the FAX Order Form to Wal-Mart your malaria medication order should arrive in about 10 days - no more hassles over getting a year's supply, no more "partial" prescriptions, no more calling or chasing around to find a pharmacy with an adequate supply, no more having the costs of these required anti-malarials counting against your medical plan's lifetime max, no more submitting expense reports to be reimbursed for these medications because Wal-Mart bills the company directly. And as an added plus, the volume discounts derived from ordering all of these medications through Wal-Mart will result in reduced overall costs to ExxonMobil.

The Rules:

1. ONLY U.S. based ExxonMobil employees (and their dependents) on EXPAT assignments and U.S. ROTATORS are eligible - not business travelers or contractors.
2. ONLY malaria chemoprophylaxis medications can be ordered using this program - not personal prescriptions.
3. Medications can ONLY be shipped to a U.S. address - medications cannot be shipped outside the U.S., either directly or through company mail.
4. Medications can only be ordered using the attached form which MUST be FAXed from the doctor's office.
5. Prescriptions MUST be written by a physician with a valid U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) registration number.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Can Wal-Mart ship malaria medications to me in Africa?

NO. Mail ordered malaria medications can only be shipped to a U.S. address.

I don't plan on coming back to the U.S. every year. Can I have the medications sent to someone else to bring back for me?

NOT RECOMMENDED. Since the prescription will be in someone other than the traveler's name he or she could have the medication confiscated and could even be detained by the Customs authorities.

What if I no longer maintain a U.S. mailing address?

You can arrange to have the medication shipped to one of our U.S.-based Exxon Mobil medical clinics or to the Expat center where you can pick it up.

Can the MOH staff in my assignment location fill out the form and FAX it to Wal-Mart for me?

Probably not. The prescriber must have a valid U.S. Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) registration number.

Can I get the Anti-malarial Prescription Form completed by my doctor and just bring it to a Wal-Mart Store?

NO. This program is only set up to be used as a Faxed mail order program. If you bring a prescription for anti-malarials to a pharmacy yourself, you will not get the reduced rate, you may not be able to obtain a year's supply of the medication and the expenses for the medication will not be directly reimbursed by the Company, so you will need to complete an Expense form to be reimbursed.

My co-worker is a Business Partner and also needs to take malaria medications. Can he/she use this process?

NO. Only ExxonMobil employees and eligible dependents can use this service. The EXPAT center provides Wal-Mart with the list of EXPAT and rotator employees and family members who are eligible to participate in this program.

Can I obtain other medications for myself and my family members using this mail order process?

NO. You need to continue to obtain other prescription medications using your Employee Benefit pharmacy provider.

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
